- ❑ This is the end of the Holy month of RAMADAN. It is also called LEBARAN in Indonesia.
- ❑ *Idul Fitri* celebrates the completion of a month of self-restraint by uniting in prayers and expressions of forgiveness. Food is shared in their homes with friends and family.
- ❑ During the days before *Idul Fitri* the markets are very busy with people buying special foods, fresh flowers and new clothes.
- ❑ *Idul Fitri* is a time of blessings from ALLAH, and continues for three days. It is a time of feasting, celebration and gift-giving. Guests are offered KETUPAT — decorative little packages woven from the leaves of young coconut palms and filled with food.
- ❑ Delicacies, especially dates, are included in the menu along with watermelon and rambutan.
- ❑ Artists visit the towns to perform special calligraphy texts and blessings. Cards are painted with seasonal motifs and sold to passers-by.

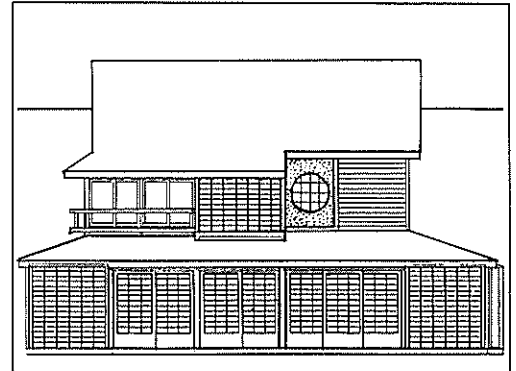
